 The 10 December 1814.

I am Comptroller with the Direction
 of the Lord Commissioners of the Admiralty
 contained in a Letter from Mr. Croker of which
 the enclosed is a copy. I have to desire
 that in the event of Mr. Paul Hyde de Kerville
 applying for a Pass for the purpose therein
 mentioned, you will grant one accordingly.

I have further to inform you that I have
 granted Passports for two Vessels to carry French
 Passengers, the one from America to France and
 the other from America to the French West
 India Islands, Copies of which Passports I enclose
 herewith, and you are of course to respect
 the Vessels bearing the Originals, should they
 make their appearance, and be in conformity
 with the terms thereof.
