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you (marked A) one of the Proclamations
issued by the ~~Commander~~ Commander in Chief to
encourage generally this description of Emigration
also (marked B) Copies of particular Orders
which have been issued in furtherance of
the Views with which it was deemed
judicious to give this public encouragement
to People of any and every description
to resort to our protection from the United
States, and (marked C) Extracts of some
Letters from the Commander in Chief to
myself on the same Subject.

By these Documents you will observe
that the Captains and Commanders of
His Majesty's Ships on this Station are
not only obliged to receive all Persons so
choosing to avail themselves of our protection
but are also enjoined to forward and
facilitate as much as possible their coming
to us; no discrimination whatever being left
to the Officers as to the Age, Sex and Abilities
of the Persons they are to receive under these
Orders, and the Commander in Chief's
Proclamation on this Subject having been
(with much pains) widely diffused throughout
all the Counties bordering the American
Shores
