Washington City, 9 June 1846

My Dear Sir

Our Committee last night resolved to postpone the sailing of our vessel until Sept. This came to this result in consequence of the failure of about sixty of our expected emigrants, leaving us only fifty seven who would be ready July 1. —

I will thank you to say to Messrs. Somebody (I have lost the names. I made of their names, or I would write them myself) not trouble you about it that we shall not want their vessel. But that I shall give them a call when we are ready to charter in the fall. —

∴ They resolved also that our Medical Students should come home & study. — Will you please inform me what is the expense at Danvers, & how long Fletcher will remain there?

About the Chais — Mrs. Lady has made other arrangements, before I wrote to her. Best regards to Mrs. H.
