very kind and attentive to him and much gratified with the
information he gave him, he would not receive any
thing for his services. The expense incurred was
for horse shoeing one dollar which W^m Scotland paid him
self and the expense of his horse at Levery was five
dollars which I paid and which I consider as paying
my annual payment to Colonization Society. I have
great hopes in the next visit of Scotland, many have
been since he left talking with my servant who says
they will try to get off, the women are much opposed
of some eager to go. (Monsieur) The old man
had a severe attack the short time it lasted. I hope he
will return to you in health. My best wishes
are with him with assurances of my esteem
and regard I am respectfully
