

Annapolis 11th Feb. 1847

Sir

I have just received at this hour information from Mrs. Biss, widow of J. C. Biss dec^d that Mr. Biss in his life time drew a draft in favor of you or some person in America, Mr. Hicks since the time of the drawing of the draft & ~~the~~ before the death of Mrs. Biss made a demand on Mr. Biss for the amount due you which he paid, in your acct, will you be so kind as to inform me if the draft was ever paid if not then Hicks received so much in your acct which is all well enough, if not I shall as attorney for Mrs. Biss, call on him to refund

I had not the pleasure of the company of Mr. Hall your son, who I had heard you so often speak of while you were here, which I regret much, but I have heard those speak very favorable of him who had made of his company — Hoping & that God will spare your usefull life many days for usefull purposes — let me say to you before I close, that you may think that my charge for the protest was high, but really it is only what is always been paid for any thing of the kind, as I am generally guided by the amount of the goods lost —
