

Richmond. April 14. 1847.

Mr James Hall

Dear Sir.

You will do me a favor by informing me when the next vessel sails for Siberia and from what port - Will she go to each of the colonial settlements? Shall we able to secure freight for a few articles for Mr Day?

I am happy to inform you that we have secured the services of Mr Day, and that he has entered upon his work in earnest, occupying principally as the field of his labor the region south of the St Johns River - He will commence also a Manual labor school, securing the assistance of a man by the name of A P Davis - If you know him, can you inform me respecting his qualifications, character? Will he be a suitable coadjutor of Mr Day?

I will trouble you with another question - Can any provision be made for the instruction of free colored men, in the elements of an English education, in Baltimore? We shall probably find it necessary to secure the
