

Easton, August 11th 1847

Dear Sir,

Yours of Aug⁶ has just come to hand and I am obliged to you for letting me know the time of the vessel's sailing. The servant puts (vain excuses in the way of his going so that I do not now believe he ever meant to go, but supposed that by proposing such a thing he could prevent his being hired out. As this is a matter which must depend entirely on his own will (as it is not right to compel him to take the step against his will) all I can do is to express my regret that I have given you so much trouble for nothing and my indebtedness to you for your attention to this matter.
