Annapolis Oct. 7. 1847

On reading the account in the Journal of the embarkation of the Emigrants to Liberia last month, I observed a mistake or two into which you had been led, possibly by me, though I can hardly think so, which it may be as well to correct. Blackstone himself was the only individual among them who belonged to me. His wife and child were free persons. So also was the wife of Dr. Weems' man Leffer. This may be a matter of little moment, yet it is as well that you should be made acquainted with the facts in the case.
