Dear Sir

I take the opportunity of
writing you a small letter by the packet. to
inform you that my Bro. Tho^s Lander is dead
He died a few days before the return of my hus-
band, I have considered that it would be proper
for me to send you a few lines concerning
the estate, he desired to see my husband ^{as he did} before
concerning the estate, but he departed this life before
he came, so as he is dead I think it would be
best for me to say something to you about it
I wish you to send me 1/2 M^o. Tobacco and the
rest in cash as usual, as I have been informed
by my husband, that there has been no joint-
letters received from the heirs, but for the time
to come we will come together and consult each
other what we will do, I would like to know
from you how the estate stands Mr Jackson
says he did not know how the estate stood but
he had rec^d fifty six M^o Dollars, from you on my
acct. says he did not interfere with it much
expecting Bro. Thomas would go over by the
packet when he came home, but as Bro. Thomas
is dead I remain the only heir so I hope you
will send me word how things is, if the estate
cannot be settled without some one from here
please let me know, Mr Jackson says he don't
want to come home again if it can be settled
without.
