

answered "I paid Kemar" in the manner indicated, as herein before explained. Mr Roberts left, saying "no return was made by K to the Society (or something to this amount) or you would not have been called on a second time for the money". After this Mr S says "he received a letter from Dr Hall about the note," but did not answer it, conceiving Mr Roberts would in due time report the case to the Board. He therefore rested in perfect security about it, & was only undeceived when I, this day, again demanded it, & the above written facts are my report. So much for Spicknell's case.  
Case No 2. Zachariah Housell (\$5) says he paid Roberts & offered to produce his receipt.  
Case No 3. Josiah Sunderland (\$25) says he involved himself on Kemar's account in \$160, besides the manumission of, and sending to Liberia, his own slaves, & for this, instead of his paying us \$25, he looks for some compensation from the Md St. Col. Society.  
Case No 4. Major Wm B Stone of Port Tobacco says he paid Kemar the \$5 he subscribed for the Liberia Packet, but would donate a new 5 to the Society, which he did not pay.  
Case No 5. Robt Carr says he paid his 5 also to Kemar for the Packet, but would donate \$2 to the Society which he did not pay.
