indeed. My brother had a protection from Governor  
Roberts, & has a wife in Monrovia. I have just  
received a letter from my father, written at  
Monrovia Dec. 30. 1847, asking about my brother  
George. I hope, Sir, you will be able to let me  
something to write back. And if you can tell  
me anything will you do so as soon as may be  
convenient for you, so that I may send a letter  
to Monrovia by the next Packet.
