Dr James Hall Dear Sir

I forwarded a letter to you today. Dr Bacon has come out with a most outrageous attack on ~~the~~ ^{the} Colonists.

How far can I be borne out in stating the report of Rumour as to his conduct on the Coast of Africa. He was a guest of the Slave trader. He was a man of violence. He was a loafer. Some say he drank brandy (is this substantiated?)

I wish you would write me by word in reply to this & give me the names of people asserting. I send you a copy of the Day Book.
