My Dear Sir

I pray you to excuse my engaging any of your time even to read & reply to my short enquiries but the anxiety & peculiar state in which the two Boys of Greece stand induces me to obtain for them the earliest information when they might be ready to embark and secure if possible a little room for their very small freight. The Sons of Walaker their deceased Master behave badly & put every obstacle in the way to oppose their going but so they will and if they do not pay them the money they hold of them they will start with what little they have, but next week I hope all will be ready. They only wait for the signal, if I can properly get down I hope to see you and put them under your directions papers & also - pray let me hear from you. I wrote you Tuesday ago I hope you received my note the Packet made a fine sail from Monrovia. I hope all wells
