I can assure Sir your letter dated July 7th was received by me with much pleasure, I was extremely glad you expressed your self about my welfare, and let me assure you shall always have my greatest regard, although my prosperity is not as rapid as you may expect, although I thank God it is no worse, and Sir I am no more related to the Yankees to be any thing like hard especially with them mask particular by them the spark of Colonization ever fallen fire for the good of the colored race, I am glad Sir that the draft came safe in to your hands which I believe you will attend to and deliver safe to my Brother Charles, this I feel satisfied about I believe Sir you will give him all the instruction he may need and assistance in getting his family.
