

Richmond 29th May 48

Dr. Hall,

Sir please excuse nervousness from sickness, and the better I am in. I am in this place waiting for that contrary Brother of mine, to come home and settle my ^{father's} will. In the mean time the Officers have attempted to arrest me.

Now Lawyer Maxwell and Law^r Baxter who is the States Attorney and both friendly the Colony in fact Men of the Colonization Soc. have in I trust entrusted me to write to you. begging you if you please to send me a certificate of Liberian citizenship with the stamp of your Office on — and with it they will be able to lift ~~me~~ me from my present difficulty. — I just such such a certificate as you gave me once before when I was in Baltimore. If you please send this favour forthwith and Obli^g Yours
