

Dear Sir

Cambridge June 26. 1849

I did not receive yours till Monday, consequently could not send the bag by Saturday's boat. I send him on today and hope my friend Parkitt will prepare him for Emigration to Liberia.

There is a man here who bought a ticket amounting to \$63, it being the amount of attendance of a witness. he threatened to warrant him for the money but has agreed to take \$35. I told him I would maintain the circumstance to whoever should take him & if he thought his services were worth the money (\$35) I would pay it to him (provided they sent me the money) - If therefore our friend Parkitt should feel disposed hereafter to pay the \$35 he can send it to me for the man.
