Cambridge June 27. 1849

The steam boat had not started 2 minutes yesterday before an Officer came with a warrant to stop the boy for the amount of Post for attendance of one of the witnesses which he bought. - The witness was a Mr. Harker a Negro purchase and to whom the boy was offered for sale - His testimony was very important - Now as Harker lives in Baltimore I think it possible that all friends who bought the bill of Coats will write him word and get him to stop him with a warrant - I write this to give you timely information so that the boy may be sent in the County or out of the way -

All friends has agreed to take \$3 for the amount of the bill and if my friend Clarkett can feel free to pay it for his services I will settle it with Allfriend -

Please answer this and let me know if you received him yesterday by the steam boat Maryland and what you think of him &c. Yours respectfully
