

Cape Palmas Oct. 19th 1849

Mr. J. H. Hall

Dear Sir:

Your favour of the 19th July was duly received - and I was glad to have a fulfiling from you, My son Thomas has grown to be quite a man and as I have a good many kind folk in America that would come out to Africa if they could see any of my children, so as Thomas has a great desire to come home, and as I believe he will do all he can for the cause of Colonization; I am perfectly willing for him to come home, so if you think proper send for him by the turn of the packet he will be ready to come, I have no doubt but what it will be the means of a good many of the coloured friends coming out of my neighbourhood.

I send a letter to a Gentleman who lives down in Virginia and by the name of Dagglus Nelson Master of the post office of Westville County; I wish you to be so kind as to send it on to him.
