 would have gone now, were ready, but their Mother desired  
 them to give her until Spring, when she would make up her  
 mind to go & take this younger <sup>brother</sup> a Boy 12 or 15 years with her  
 I know not of any you could count upon with any cer-  
 tainty from here this season. I expect the Elder Hall  
 the Minister here on Sunday to Preach on the Hill. he will  
 call on me and I will show <sup>him</sup> the intelligence recent  
 received from Liberia.

I am pleased to learn your improving in health  
 Colds are very prevalent I have been confined to my house  
 & sometimes to my room from cold accompanied with a se-  
 vere and hard cough, am easier and feel better, and  
 I sincerely hope you a speedy restoration to good health  
 with all my hints to the Jones family to pay me the freight  
 of articles sent by Wesley Gros to his wife as well as postage of letters  
 from him to her; they will not come out: we will see what  
 will be done with the next. With sincere respect
