My dear Sir,

I regret that an error has been made in my bill of travelling expenses of myself & family & transportation of goods which I am obliged to ask you to rectify.

Upon inquiring of Rose Merrill & Co. what the amount of freight was I was informed about \$16.90, I ignorantly concluded that was all, & so made the charge. Today in settling up, which I did not do until we knew whether they would deduct for breakage, I found to my surprise that the \$16.90 was only expenses to New York, and that besides that sum they charge of course for freight here, and for storage &c. making in all \$41.78!! - so that I have only been actually paid \$16.90. of the whole amount, which is \$24.68 less than I have paid for said expenses.

Is it too late to rectify the error?  
It depends on yourself. I enclose the Bill
