Dear J. Hall

Dear Esteemed Sir I appropriate
this opportunity to inform you that I would be
very happy to hear from ^{you} as you said in your
last ~~to the~~ letter to me that I should have
from you by this packet. I thought by your letter
it was likely that I ^{should have} receive some returns
from you by this packet but I suppose that
circumstances were so that you could not
but I hope that you will do the best you can for
me by the first chance you have
Kind Sir if you should send any thing you will
please to send a one Hoghead of Tobacco of the
best quality for my trade and the remainder
if this should be any send in money if
I will not say any thing to you about
hiring the letters for I believe that ^{will} ~~you~~
do to promote our interest to the fullest
extent

The reason that I desire you to send
the money is because we can get goods for
cheaper on the coast cheaper than you can
of a different kind all except tobacco
