I send a bill against Am Col Soc for 50¢ for landing all  
their Emigrants baggage with all other freight for the  
Society at Monrovia & Sinoe, they might suppose it high  
but it is not, it would cost their Agents just about half as  
much again to accomplish the same work, I also send  
Gen Lewis certificate certifying that I landed as above stated  
I collected all freight money as ordered, which you will see as  
per account, some may have got off, having to measure all  
but I done the best I could of a hard job.

In my account current you find that the qu-  
antity of oil differs from that of the Service, In making  
out the Invoice I deducted 6 per cent, so this will  
explain, you will find the oil better this time than  
bad last voyage must have been taken from Grand  
Bapa as since then bad oil have been detected at that  
place, and boiling showed dirt water & palm butter about  
one half of the quantity this is now put a stop to, but  
we use our Trier, now constantly,
