Fred. City. June 5, 1851.

My dear Sir,

I add a line to my monthly report. I am well and in good spirits. I have been able to wake up the drowsy folks at Liberty. Good turn out on Sunday - \$19.50 in cash, some friends gained, and the colored folks stirred up mightily. Some one or more think they will emigrate to Liberia. I am urged to come again & operate at Israel's Creek, a rich neighborhood where I preached on Sunday morning & prepared my way for a future effort.

In this city there is a falling off from last year. I leave tomorrow for Hagerstown, to see Mr. Mann - the liberated slave, &c. Next Monday I take New Market in my way home having had an appointment made there for me. To this latter place I go via Moravia, and that too by steam & by rail road, so great the improvements of the present age & day!!
