Be pleased to favor me with an early reply, as the men are anxious to make all needful preparations without delay -

I regret that Mr. Seys did not command when here larger audiences. Such has always been the case here. Our people are all friendly to Colonization, and some regularly and liberally give; but the great body think the annual tax heretofore contributed is sufficient, especially when it is considered that none of our free blacks have ever availed themselves of the opportunity and benefits of the scheme. However one great and very good result has followed upon Mr. Seys' visit & efforts, in the awaking up of our free people to their subjects & the evident feeling among them now for ascertaining ~~and~~ the real condition of things abroad and on -
