Dear Sir

Your favor of 25<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> last, with Bill of Lading &c were received, also a letter from Mr McLane, with ten Emigrants and four Barrels provisions

I have purchased from the Packet, a Case of Bld. Cotton, and six Bbls Provisions and a few other articles that were indispensable, and have paid for the same in produce.

I trust the "Morgan Dix" arrived safely conveying to you the Palm Oil, and Cornwood shipped on account of the Agency.

Enclosed you will receive Bills of Lading and Invoice for Palm Oil and Hides shipped on board the Packet, and consigned to you on account of the Md. St. Col. Soc. The Oil now sold shipped together with what I have exchanged for supplies for the store leave our Cash nearly empty — I have yet on hand a good stock of trade goods, with which I hope soon to purchase
