-ual to whom a credit is entered to Liberia when they  
shall have attained the age of seven and are willing to go  
and in case they refuse to go the society employ the funds  
so raised as they may direct best, Now Doctor if you  
think favourably of such a measure I should rejoice  
to have your aid in bringing it before the public. We have  
persuaded that the children as treated would learn as much  
and be as well clad when their term expired as when  
bound, consequently no harm to the children  
and it surely believe such an arrangement brought into effe-  
-ct in this country would in a few years yield to the  
Society's aid annually a sum from five hundred  
to a thousand dollars, the foregoing is therefore <sup>respectfully</sup> submitted  
to your better judgment and long experience in matters  
appertaining to colonization by  
*Amos Phelps*  
Should the traveling agent visit this country you  
should be glad if he would call on you and  
the office retaining, necessary expenses over a million  
the agent's salary to be made by the agent  
with the name of the agent in the case only as the  
agent's name to the agent's colonization society  
shall cover the cost of the agent's salary to each individual  
named by the agent in the case to be left
