

Fredrick City April 15, 1853

Dear Sir,

The Emigrants from this place and those from the Interior of the County, to be conveyed to Baltimore on Monday the 18th cannot be accommodated in the cars designed for the white persons. The Agent of the B. Road company here, says it is necessary that a car be especially provided for them, and desires me to inform you that it is indispensable that the Agent in Wash. - or W. England - be requested to have a car brought up to Mount Airy on Monday morning by the 8 o'clock train. The Cumberland left there for our accommodation in the afternoon. -

These Agents will not hear of any orders for fare to be paid afterwards. Money does for tickets or no tickets. I have cashed a note payable at the Marine Bank & obtained from the bank here all I need. Four of twelve Emigrants have packed out - Eight remain here. I leave in the morning for Oak Orchard for the party from that neighborhood. -
