

Baltimore July 4, 1853

My Dear Sir,

Yours of the 30th ult. reached me at 5 P.M. on Saturday. I thank you for the enclosed acceptance of my order. Truly, as you anticipated it would be, too late for the emergency which occurred on this very day, and I had therefore, fearing this might be the case, provided otherwise. I called on Mr. Mickle on the 1st July - stated the case, and asked him to cash a similar order on you without your acceptance, until I heard from you. I had the fullest confidence that when I did hear, my request would be granted. Mr. M. did not hesitate at all - still I waited until past the hour of my postman on Saturday - and when all hope failed, I went to the Bank, gave the order, and received the \$100. - Tomorrow I am to give Mr. Mickle the accepted order & take back the other. -
