

Norfolk May 13. 1854

Dear Sir:

In my last letter requesting that my boxes etc sh^d not go on board the S. W. I expressed the desire that you would have those boxes placed in some safe place until my arrival, wh. I thot would be this week. I have been waiting a letter from Mr. Larrison of N. Y. giving me orders for my future course, & until this sh^d be rec^d I have been unable to act. It has just reached me, & indicates the pleasure of our For. Committee to be that I shall go to the Virginia Convention just about to assemble, & hence to the Theol. Sem. near Alexandria to meet Mr. & Mrs. Hoffmann & Mrs. Payne. This being the course marked for me, I shall not be able to be in Baltimore before the 1st of June. Will you my dear D^r have the goodness to see my boxes, trunk & Carpet bags securely stored until I call for them? The boxes (except the one in wh. the Carpet bags & bundles are) I shall allow to remain in Balt. until I sail - which will probably be next Mon. They may therefore be placed where they can be kept securely till then. The Trunk & bags may be kept stored with the boxes but so that I can get at them readily when I call. In Ma-
