My Dear Sir

Now it appears we shall not have more than 100 all told, including the N. Sex. empts. — from whom we have nothing further. If they do not go we shall have 80.

We shall know I hope soon, who will, & who will not go — so that we may buy accordingly — not have an extra cent. on our hands! —

I inclose a letter from Mr. Pinney — also one from A. Thomas about that Tobacco which I presume will be there this evening —
