Dear Sir: Your favor of the 10th with inclosure as stated - aft. on Treas. Md. Col. Society for \$400⁰⁰/₁₀₀ - was rec^d yesterday by Mr. McLain, who would have written in acknowledgment had he been able; but he is down again - confined at home - in bed today - large blister on his side and back - not much worse, but no better, and far from being a well and sound man. I have just been over to see him. I heartily wish for his own sake particularly, and also for the sake of colonization, that he could get well. The cheap & fr. protom. can get along after a fashion - perhaps as well as any other substitute, but business plenty for all hands, and not much time for play.

Mr. McLain says he is sorry to trouble you so much, but requested me to call your attention to A. Thomas' bill mentioned in the postscript to his letter to you of the 9th, which you seem to have forgotten.
