My Dear Sir,
Mr. M' Lane has shown me
your remarks on our circular. I am
very sorry that it does not fully
meet your approbation. I do not
at all understand that the language
of the ^{circular} commits us to the founding
of a new Jersey Settlement - but an
Settlement in the Interior to see whether
the climate there be more healthy
than on the coast. Surely this is
the purport of the second Resolution
of the Directors. As an interior
Settlement has been a favorite
idea with New Jersey an allusion
to that fact seemed natural
