Dear Sir

The Penn = Colonization Society have been charged with the erection of a Monument to the Memory of Gov: Buchanan over his Remains at Passa Cove, and they are desirous of doing the very best with the limited means, \$300. appropriated for the purpose. As you have had experience in such a matter and a thorough knowledge of Liberia, I venture to solicit your full and candid opinion respecting a design, material and size - whether in one piece or more - most likely to accomplish the object in view, and which could be landed at Passa and put up there. Is granite the most durable in that humid atmosphere? Have they the facilities at Passa for landing ^{transporting} and erecting heavy blocks of stone necessary to the purpose if one or more pieces be agreed upon and sent out? Please favor us with your views whenever it may best suit your convenience and greatly oblige yours very respectfully, Wm Copping
