My Dear Sir

Yours of the 28<sup>th</sup> came yesterday  
and I thought, to save cross fins, I  
would delay a day & then answer.  
I must confess I do not like your "Ginn-  
Chants Bank!" Shame on them.

I am glad to hear what you  
say about the ship — but will now  
say Dec. 1 — & 250 all told. My  
opinion is we shall have her full — the  
first voyage. And will you go in her?  
I wish I could go too — but dear  
me! — I wish I could go with  
you to Capon — but Dr. Sugentbal is yet  
unable to do any thing — & Mrs. Guiley  
is sick & Mr. Guiley is with her —  
and I am factotum here! My  
family still keep well — I am  
better of my cold — Dr. S. has  
not bled again — but had a very  
bad bilious diarrhoea, with fever —  
and is greatly prostrated —
