Yours of the 16th is received with its inclosures, and not to keep you longer "waiting on me" I have you acc. of purchases &c. receipted \$1,009.64— also bill of passage of Engls. receipted \$245.00— and also account of the manner in which \$590.65 of Mrs. Mary Sharps \$700.00 was paid by her Agent John Chitwood, together with my check on the Bank of Commerce Boston for \$109.33 to balance— that bring the all that is left toward the expenss of supporting her 34 people six months in Siberia— Will you please send Ma. Col. Soc. receipt—

You do not say any thing of the Missy or Fawn!— Asar has nothing by the latter, I conclude she is not yet thro' Quarantine—
