My Dear Sir

I send by the Bg Ship by the accounts, made out so far I am able after the form and instructions of Mr. Prond. which I hope you will find correctly executed. I also send copies of the Inventories from Decr 1854 to June 30th 1856. as requested.

The Immigrants per Olivera Onond are getting along as well as could be expected. Most of them have had an attack of the fever There has been but one death since I last wrote you (by the E. Owen), and this was a woman who was quite sick when she landed and so continued till her death. I am making all preparations in my power for Immigrants that may be received in December or January next by the "Stebens". How far I may be successful in obtaining a sufficient quantity of rice for the consumption of them and these remains yet to be seen. My tobacco which is the chief article of trade for which rice may be obtained was so nearly exhausted that I had to purchase a fresh from the Bg.
