Dear Sir

I have this morning received your letter of Oct. 31, with check enclosed for \$142, paid in New York; paid Broker 25 cents for carrying it; paid Robinson \$142 for Steering Apparatus, and receipt, which I enclose. I think I never got cash on New York paper before, for less than $\frac{1}{4}$ per cent, which, in this case, would have been 35 cents.

I do not believe I can be with you on the 12th. And there are some symptoms that the boats are becoming tame.

I will tell the Trustees what you say about tobacco. I had thought of it.
