This day week I was in the Colonization Rooms Washington D.C. where I met with the Rev Mr McLain, who informed me that you would embark from Baltimore in the vessel which is expected to sail the 20th ult for Liberia - He also advised me to address a letter to you relative to the case of Josephine Tyler daughter of Harry Tyler of Clay Ashland - Josephine has been afflicted for several years with enlargement of the Tonsels indeed more or less from her childhood - Much was done in this Country for her - they were burnt with Caustic &c but all to little effect - a short time previous to her leaving this Country Dr John B Cochran our family Physician was of the opinion that her Tonsels ought to be cut out but Dr Stribling an older & more experienced Physician entertained a different opinion - so she left the United States without having
