In 1853 Cyrus Taylor liberated by Mrs Ellin Lovell

Liberia - Mrs Lovell has never heard from him & believes
that he is certainly dead or he would have written
to her - I however have recently learned that he
is not dead but is living in Buckhannon - I have
promised to enquire for him & let Mrs Lovell know the
result & would be much obliged to you if you should
see him & you will impress upon him his duty to
write to his former Mistress -

and finally grant you an abundant entrance
