

Newport, Oct. 10<sup>th</sup> 1857.

Dr James Hall,

Dear Sir,

Three coloured persons on my farm, Charlotte & her two sons, William & Joshua, have reported themselves as desirous of emigrating to Cape Palmas by the next expedition. Charlotte is 63 years of age - is the oldest person on my farm. William is 36 years of age, & Joshua is about 23 years of age. Sandy & Hanson Neale, who went to Liberia at the same time with Walter, were sons of Charlotte of ages intervening between Wm & Joshua. A letter received by last mail, from Ambrose Simpson communicated the melancholly intelligence, that Charlott's son Sandy, & Henry Carpenter, an emigrants from my farm a number of years ago, were of the 25 who perished when
