Sir

I have
 tried my uttermost to obtain a situation
 of the kind that I mentioned to you, since
 I have been here. And I find that I cannot
 succeed in doing so. Therefore I write to let
 you know as you told me if I could not succeed
 in obtaining it, to return back to "Baltimore"
 there you would get me such. Will you please
 answer this as soon as you possibly can and
 what arrangements you have made with the person
 if he agrees to take me as an apprentice under
 him. For as such is my expectation. By so
 doing Sir you will confer a very great favour
 upon me. My object is to return back to "Liberia"
 as soon as I have obtained it for there it
 will be very profitable to me and not only
 to me, to my country also. I suppose that
 you are aware of me being a native born
