My Dear Sir

We have this a.m. by the English Mail, two letters from Siberia. The M.C. Stevens reached Cape Mount the 9 & Monrovia the 13 June. There had been one death, & plenty cases of Measles on the voyage. — Dr. Roberts says that they have cut the bushes off a marsh near Camryburg & there have been some 15 or 17 genuine cases of Af. fever there.

That is about all the news we have. You doubtless have plenty. — Not a word is said about the Regina Coeli — of which we wanted most of all to hear —
