Dear Sir. You have doubtless heard of our Cambridge Company, who have pledged themselves to emigrate to Liberia. Some of them, I think, will go in November. I have promised to furnish one of their leaders with the bill of fare for emigrants on the voyage, that they may make up their minds to be contented with it, or provide themselves with such additions as they must have. For this purpose, I find in the Repository for May, 1857, your letter to McLean, of Jan. 17, 1857, and your account of "Every Day Life on Shipboard," in the Repository for Oct. 1857. I believe something more has been published somewhere.
