Dear Sir

I forward the enclosed application for passage to Liberia from a very worthy man, Corn. C. Glasgow who expects to make Africa his home with his children & grandchildren named - He is in good health, very vigorous, is worth some 3 or 4000 dollars which he wishes to take with him in goods of some kind.

There are also three men who are licensed Ministers of the Presbyterian Church, who will be appointed to a new mission station some 25 miles from Cape Palmas north or west on the coast, who with their wives, and 4 children and a man & his wife, a freed, also desirous of going by the N.C. Steamer the 1st of May
