Dr Hall T. A. 24 April 4th 1839
My dear Sir

We are about to send out,
as you are probably aware, three colored
men from the Ashmun Institute as mis-
sionaries to Africa. These young men are
to labour entirely among the natives of
Liberia. Two of them we propose to locate
somewhere between Sierra & Cape Palmas
on the Sea Coast, & one among the natives
in the interior from Monrovia. My object
in writing is to inquire whether there is
any physician at Sierra, who could at-
tend the two missionaries & their families
who are to be located in that neighborhood,
provided they go there to be acclimated.
In some respects it would be advantageous
for them to acclimate near the place
of their future labours. I would also be
obliged to you for any suggestions you
may make in relation to the native towns
