I improve the opportunity offered by the Mail Steamer to drop you a few lines by the way of England. I am happy to inform you that the Emigrants the Evans family are doing well. There has been but one death among them, and that an infant of about ten months old, a grandchild of the old man. They have all had the fever and are doing well; and express themselves as being satisfied with the Country, people treatment and so. The old man is however very destitute of means necessary to enable him to erect a home for his family. He has it is true gotten together a small portion of the frame and a few boards but the rainy season is now about to set in and for the next two months or more he will scarcely be able to do anything, and at the expiration
