letter for Mr C. Stevens was received I was sorry  
to hear of your indisposition but hope on this  
season you your health will be restored  
As there is nothing stirring here of moment I shall  
not trouble you with a long letter James M  
Thompson takes passage in the season with  
the view of completing his studies which  
I hope he will but would rather he had  
adopted some other pursuit for a living I think  
he has a constitutional affection that will  
disqualify him from undergoing much hardship  
or bodily exercise that is what one should  
possess in a great degree who wishes to practice  
Medicine in this country with any success  
I hope the winter he may spend in America  
may brace him up and rid him of his  
troubles. The Emigrant who came out in  
the Stevens are doing well also the Missionaries  
neither Mr Evans wife nor any of his family have  
as yet desired to return to their old home  
and luxuriate on their favorite dainties but  
how long or that sensation may arise in them
