Dear Doctor, I learned at 8 O'clock
last evening that you left the shore
sick, and would not be in shore to-
day. I was so glad that you were well
and hope that you have recovered.

Our clerk went up to see Christmas

ing from the effects of "potations deep and
strong" this is a sad trait.

Please receive by this boat
2 Ashes Tobacco, the weight
as follows, of which please make
a note at once in your memo book -
I will have the samples searched for.

of Powder
