I had partially anticipated the orders contained in your letter of today, and have turned over to the Government all goods &c. and sent an inventory of the same to Mr Dennis; but the receivers on the part of the Government would not permit any prices to be attached to the inventory; upon some frivolous pretext or other, which you will observe on the heading of inventory sent to Mr Dennis. I was in hopes of sending all my accounts by this vessel. But on account of the Government acting so slowly in receiving the materials &c appertaining to the receptacle I will be detained, & will have to forward by the Beach. These Officials are all disposed to be a little plaguy and I must humor them.

I am in hopes to send my accounts in time for the "Stevens", they if possible will leave here on Monday 4th February '61
