

Please find enclosed Inv. & B.L. for Palm Oil & Camwood shipped on board the "Stevens" of Hall & Co, and a sketch of amount to be passed to our credit, and that will be charged to you in our next General account. It is likely that we shall have to draw on you for amount of Import duties on the cargo of your next vessel — We shall not of course do this if it can be avoided.

We cannot venture yet to advise your sending Powder in Galb. Iron Kegs — We desire to have our private order filled with the wooden Kegs, as the article Gunpowder is too important to trade to risk its sale by needless innovations.

It is impossible for us at present to say how accounts stand between us, yet ^{we are} certain that when the value of our own Oil shipped at present on your account is taken into consideration we shall not be in arrears.

Your Father will be able to impart to you all kinds of information — so we close.
